Here is a list of all the organizations that's currently under SOAR, they are all under different categories, ranging from academic, cultural, greek-letter, and that's just listing a few. They also include a short description of what each org is about on their website. If you don't see a club you're interested, feel free to create your own by visiting the SOAR office. In addition to these orgs, each college has their own college specific clubs which relates to the theme of that individual college. This can be found on your college's website.



Join the Student Union Assembly, also known as SUA, if you are interested in making campus-wide decisions. They are the official undergraduate student government at UC Santa Cruz. They hold weekly meetings which anyone can attend. Each college also has their own student government you can join. This is called the student senate or parliament in which you focus on making decisions for your own college.
